

Abetare Gojani, The Executive Director of The Foundation House Biography

Abetare Gojani is a civil society leader and digital transformation expert with over 15 years of experience advancing inclusive development, civic participation, and cross-sector collaboration in Kosovo. She currently serves as the Executive Director of The Foundation House (formerly IPKO Foundation), one of the country's longest-standing civil society organizations, with more than 25 years of impact at the intersection of technology, education, youth empowerment, and democratic engagement.

Since joining the organization in 2010, Abetare has led its strategic evolution into a recognized ecosystem builder, connecting civil society actors, public institutions, academia, and the private sector around shared goals of just, sustainable, and inclusive development. Under her leadership, The Foundation House has reached over 50,000 young people across Kosovo, with a strong focus on empowering women and girls, as well as marginalized communities including Roma, Ashkali, Egyptian, and rural populations.

Her work is distinguished by the integration of grassroots civic engagement with digital innovation. Through programs in digital literacy, artificial intelligence, media literacy, social innovation, and civic advocacy, she has consistently demonstrated how technology can serve as a powerful tool to strengthen participation, inclusion, and democratic processes. Abetare holds an ISO/IEC 42001 AI Management System Lead Implementer certification and is recognized for bringing a forward-looking, innovation-driven perspective to civil society leadership.

In addition to her executive role, Abetare actively contributes to governance and policy dialogue. She serves as an elected civil society representative at the Office of Good Governance of the Republic of Kosovo, where she supports institutional cooperation and participatory policymaking processes. She is also a member of the Advisory Board of the Faculty of Mathematical and Natural Sciences at the University of Prishtina, fostering stronger links between academia, innovation, and civil society.
